At first it has great detail; then some detail, yet more abstract; finally, a single home, solid and sure, without a driveway or comfort of surroundings. Sometimes artists are unable to tell us what their paintings mean. The photo below, entitled "Isolation," shows the subject adrift in the ocean or standing in a cloud. Without this method to express feelings, residents may never tether through sharing or feeling resolution.

Residents completed these pieces during **A Fresh Canvas: An Alzheimer's Arts Program.** A Fresh Canvas, funded by the Bella and Max Shulman Family Fund of the Jewish Community Foundation as well as other donors, is immeasurable as it provides expressive art therapy, music therapy, movement and music groups so that all our patients with dementia - even if just for a moment- can connect with their life, their loved ones and their cherished memories.
